Solution 1

(i) The author complained that his friends were not aware of different forms of coffee.

Hence, the correct answer is option (b).

(ii) The writer calls the plant genius as it creates a chemical that keeps pests away.

(iii) The author refers to humans as 'great threat to coffee' plants owing to people's fondness for drinking coffee.

(iv) Stimulants is the option that conveys the same meaning as 'energiser'. Hence, the correct answer is option (d).

(v) Fats and carbohydrates turn into essential oils leading to <u>the</u> <u>characteristic taste and aroma to the coffee bean</u>.

(vi) The writer calls the bland green bean turning into a flavourful coffee bean an interesting phenomenon.

Coffee beans are like any other seeds rich in proteins, fats and all necessary ingredients for giving birth to a new plant.

(vii) To get stronger coffee, more coffee powder has to be used.
